- Workshops and Training





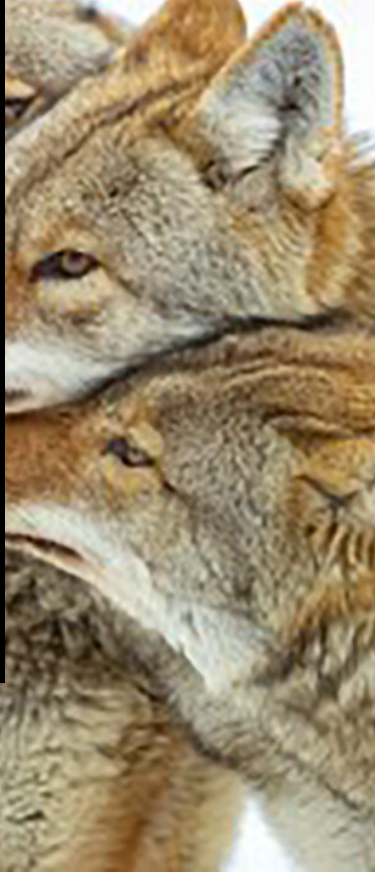


## **MONTH AT GLANCE**

In the month of January, the Neighborhood Coyote Program was created. Kick-off meetings, with each participating city, began in the month of December and culminated in January. The kick-off meetings consisted of collaborative communication between City staff and the SGV COG. The duration of the month was spent drafting user-friendly promotional materials such as: a coloring book, program brochures, informational brochures, and flyers.

Additionally, the Neighborhood Coyote Program hotline, website, and online reporting tools were created in preparation for the program launch. A program launch press release was sent to each City in preparation for the launch. The Neighborhood Coyote Program publicly launched, January 27th.

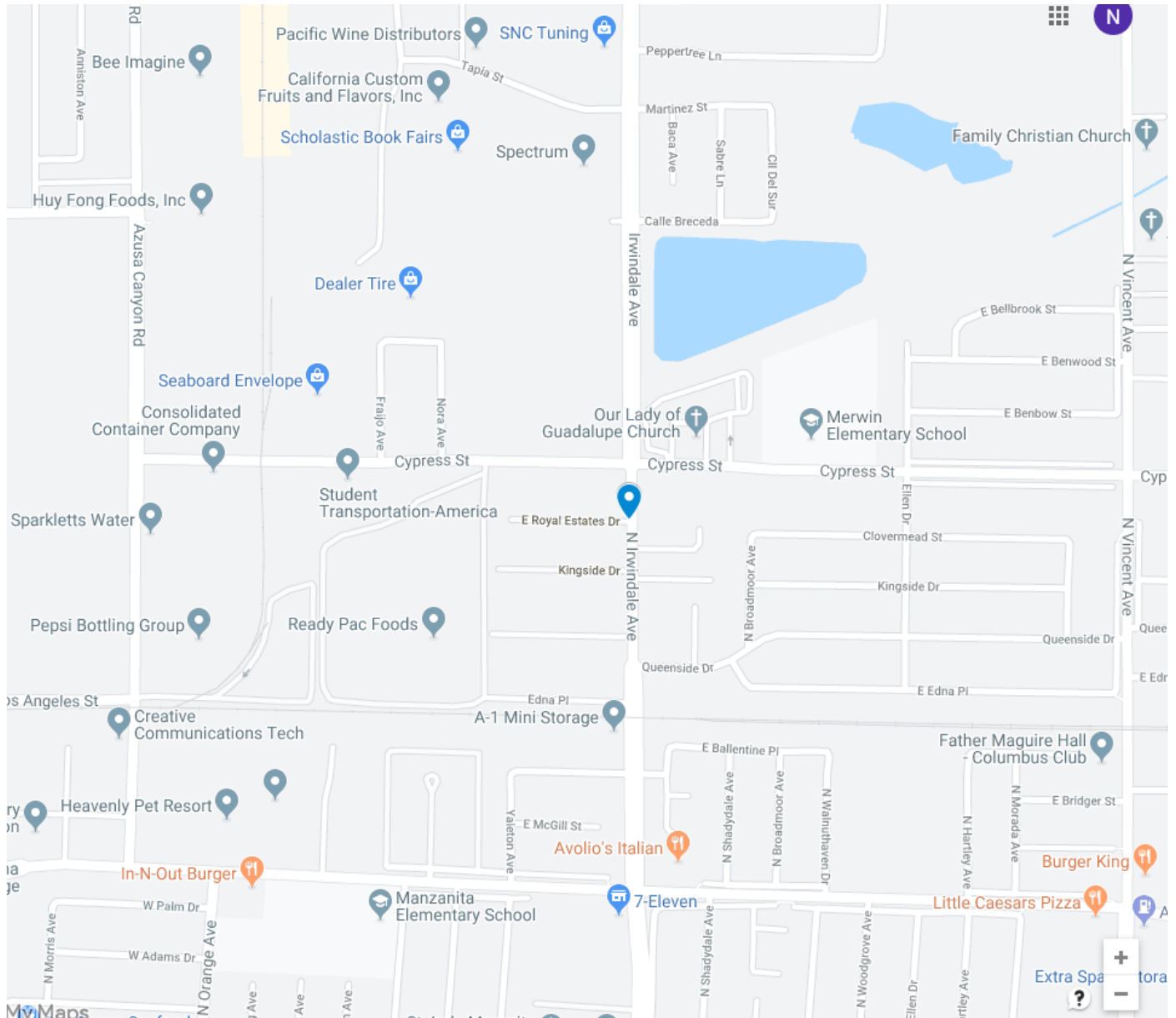
# MONTHLY TOTALS AND RESPONSE LEVELS

Of the interactions reported, The Neighborhood Coyote Program responded **1** report by phone and email. The report, was classified as **Response Level 1**. Response Level 1 includes the hearing or sighting of coyotes. Hazing techniques were not used by the reporters. The report was made directly to the hotline and documented in Coyote Cacher.
