
The Neighborhood Coyote Program provides the following services:

- Hotline Access
- Reporting Tools
- Referrals to Resources
- Pet Safety Planning
- Crisis Intervention
- Workshops and Training



In the month of February, the Neighborhood Coyote Program received a consistent amount of reports from the prior month. Residents began utilizing the hotline, online reporting, and Coyote Cacher. All promotional materials were delivered to the SGVCOG office within the last week of February. The materials have been rationed and will be ready to be delivered to the City in the month of March.


Within the City of Irwindale, there was 1 report of coyote interactions for the month of February. Of the interactions reported, The Neighborhood Coyote Program responded to 1 report. The program made contact with the reporter by phone and/or by email. The report provided was classified as **Response Level 1**. Response Level 1 includes the hearing or sighting of coyotes. Hazing techniques were not use by the reporter. The report was made online at the Neighborhood Coyote reporting form. There was a total of 1 coyote seen in the City of Irwindale in the month of February.

The activity reported was a sighting of a coyote in the City. There is not enough information to determine improvement areas within the City, however, there may be an opportunity to focus attention on providing education to residents about the Neighborhood Coyote Program as well as normal coyote behaviors, hazing techniques, and coyote attractants.
