What is the SGVCOG NEIGHBORHOOD COYOTE Program?

The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) is a joint powers authority made up of representatives from 30 cities, 3 Los Angeles County Supervisorial Districts, and the 3 Municipal Water Districts located in the San Gabriel Valley. The SGVCOG serves as a regional voice for its member agencies and works to improve the quality of life for the more than 2 million residents living in the San Gabriel Valley. The SGVCOG works on issues of importance to its member agencies, including transportation, homelessness, the environment, and water, and seeks to address these regionally.

As interactions and conflicts increase between humans and coyotes, the NEIGHBORHOOD COYOTE Program is a regional approach to address, educate, report safety issues caused by coyotes within the San Gabriel Valley.

NEVER turn your back on them.



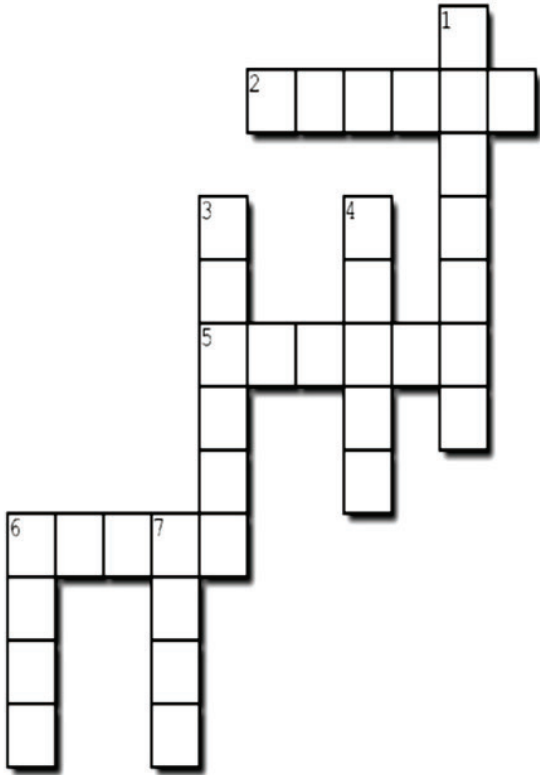
If approached, stand tall and make yourself big. Raise your voice and make loud noises.

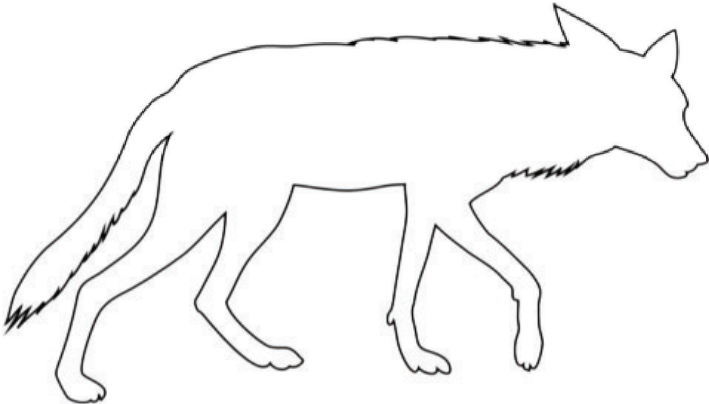

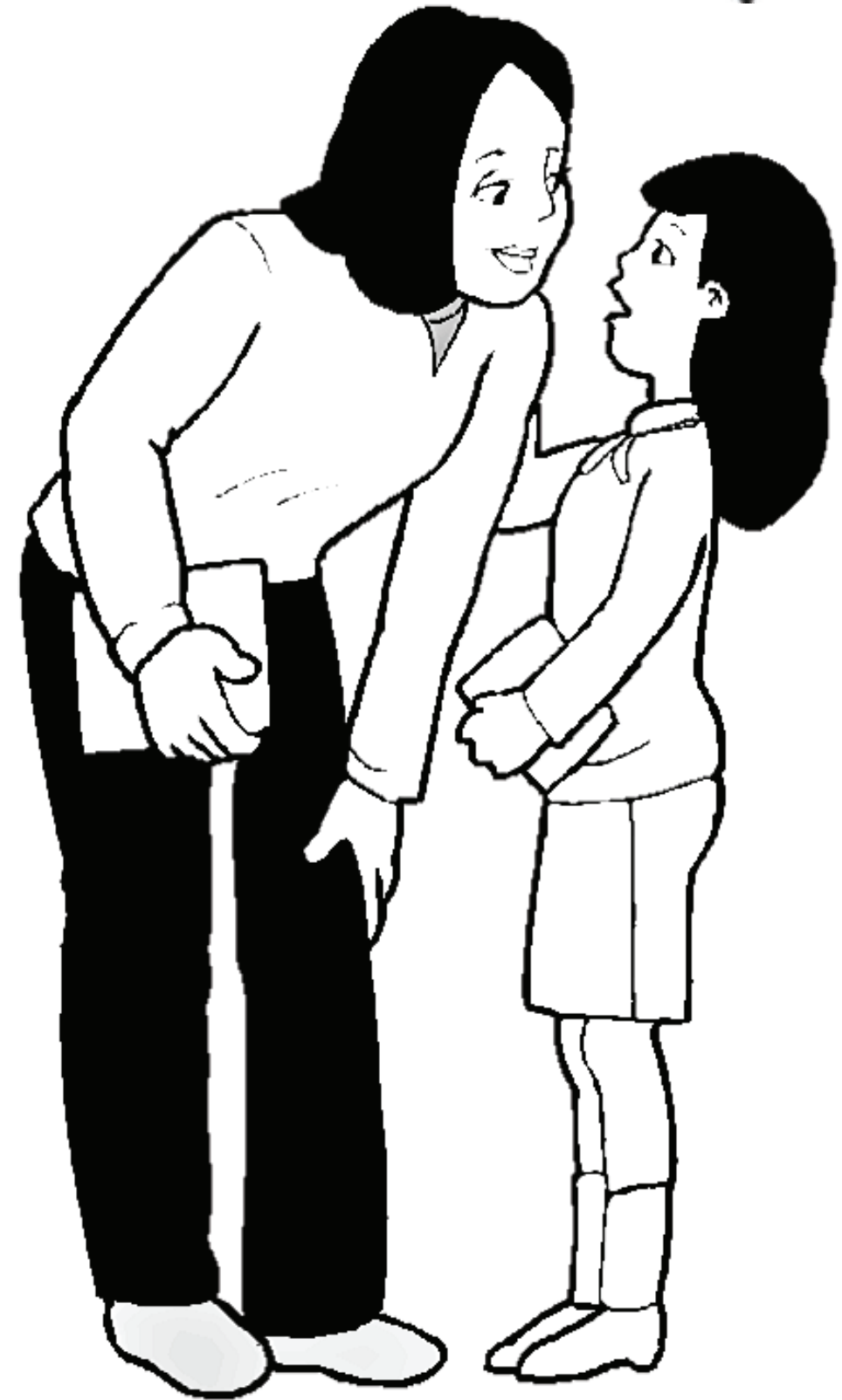
